

Saint Josephine Bakhita - Feast Day February 8th

Five things that you should know about her life and legacy.

1. She is the patron saint of victims of human trafficking. When working in the fields with her mother at age 9, she was captured and sold into slavery.



- 2. She received her name "Bakhita" from captors. The trauma of being forced into slavery affected her memory of her name, and her captors called her "Bakhita,' meaning "fortunate."
- 3. She was eventually purchased by an Italian consul, whose kind treatment transformed her life.
- 4. She gave her life to the Lord when she was sent to live with the Sisters of the Institute of the Catechumens.
- 5. She worked at the sacristy for the next 50 years, during which time she wrote her own biography. Over a 20-year period, she wrote her autobiography, and following its publication in 1930, she traveled the world, sharing her story and the hope Christ had given her.

The Old Testament Reading and Its Fulfillment in Christ

The Old Testament, spanning centuries of human history, is the foundation of God's redemptive plan for humanity. Its narratives, prophecies, and laws set the stage for the arrival of Jesus Christ, who fulfills its promises and reveals the fullness of God's salvation. Understanding how Christ fulfills the Old Testament deepens our appreciation of Scripture's unity and the unfolding of God's eternal purpose.

The Old Testament as a Prelude

The Old Testament introduces themes and patterns that foreshadow the coming of the Messiah. Central to this is the covenantal relationship between God and His people. Through figures like Abraham, Moses, and David, God establishes promises that point to future fulfillment. For example, God's covenant with Abraham in Genesis 12 includes the promise that through his offspring, "all nations on earth will be blessed." This finds ultimate fulfillment in Christ, through whom salvation extends to all people.

Similarly, the Mosaic Law, given to Israel, reveals humanity's inability to attain righteousness on its own. The sacrificial system and priesthood were temporary measures to address sin, yet they pointed forward to a perfect and eternal solution: Jesus, the ultimate High Priest and perfect Lamb of God. As Hebrews 10:1 states, the law was "only a shadow of the good things that are coming—not the realities themselves."

Messianic Prophecies

The Old Testament is rich with prophecies about the Messiah. Isaiah 53 vividly describes the suffering servant who would bear the sins of many, a clear foreshadowing of Christ's atoning death. Micah 5:2 predicts the Messiah's birthplace in Bethlehem, while Zechariah 9:9 envisions His humble entry into Jerusalem on a donkey. These prophecies not only authenticate Jesus' identity but also demonstrate God's sovereign orchestration of history.

The Psalms also play a significant role in pointing to Christ. Psalm 22, for instance, describes the suffering of the righteous one in terms that align closely with Jesus' crucifixion, including the piercing of hands and feet and the casting of lots for His clothing.

Jesus as the Fulfillment of the Old Testament

In the New Testament, Jesus Himself affirms that He fulfills the Old Testament. In Luke 24:44, He says, "Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms." His life, death, and resurrection complete the narrative begun in the Old Testament.

Jesus fulfills the role of the second Adam, succeeding where the first Adam failed. He is the ultimate descendant of Abraham, bringing blessings to all nations. As the Son of David, He establishes an eternal kingdom, transcending earthly reigns.

Moreover, Christ transforms the meaning of the Old Testament sacrifices. His death on the cross is the oncefor-all offering that achieves what the sacrifices in the temple could only symbolize. Through Him, the separation caused by sin is removed, granting believers direct access to God.

The Unity of Scripture

The Old and New Testaments are not separate or contradictory but are parts of one continuous story. The Old Testament anticipates Christ, while the New Testament reveals Him. Together, they testify to God's unchanging love and faithfulness.

For us, Christians, reading the Old Testament through the lens of Christ opens a deeper understanding of its purpose. It is not merely history or law but a testament to the relentless pursuit of humanity by a God who fulfills His promises in Christ.
