Feast Day of St. Mary Magdalene - July 22nd

Apostle of the Apostles

"Apostle of the Apostles" is the title given Mary Magdalene by St. Thomas Aquinas. "Mary, called the Magdalene, from whom seven demons came out."

At the foot of the cross

Mary Magdalene appears in the Gospels in the most dramatic moment of Jesus' life, when she accompanies Him to Calvary.

Meeting with the Risen Lord

The two disciples return home but Mary Magdalene remains at the tomb in tears. Her initial disbelief gradually turns to faith when she sees two angels and asks them if they know where Jesus' body has been taken. Then she sees Jesus Himself but fails to recognize Him. She thinks He is the gardener.

She announces Jesus' Resurrection from the dead Mary Magdalene is the first among the women following Jesus to proclaim Him as having overcome death. She is the first to announce the joyful message of Easter.



Preparing Your Heart for Sunday Mass: A Guide to Intentional Worship

Sunday Mass is not just a weekly obligation; it is a sacred encounter with the living God. Yet, in the busyness of life, we sometimes arrive at church distracted, tired, or unprepared. To fully participate in the beauty and mystery of the Mass, we must intentionally prepare our hearts and minds to receive God's grace. Here is a simple guide to help deepen your experience of Sunday worship.

1. Begin Preparation Early

Our preparation for Sunday Mass doesn't start when we enter the church—it begins days before. Throughout the week, spend a few moments each day in prayer, reading the Scriptures (especially the Sunday readings), and asking God to open your heart. When Saturday evening comes, avoid anything that will leave your mind scattered. Go to bed early if possible, and wake up on Sunday to honor the Lord's Day.

2. Embrace the Silence

Before Mass begins, try to enter the church in silence. Silence is not emptiness; it is the space where God speaks. Take a few minutes to kneel, pray, and surrender any burdens or distractions. Ask God to calm your thoughts and fill your heart with His peace. This moment of quiet will help you become more aware of His presence.

3. Dress with Reverence

While God looks at the heart, how we present ourselves outwardly can reflect our inner disposition. Dressing modestly and respectfully for Mass shows our reverence for the sacredness of the celebration and helps us approach the liturgy with dignity and humility.

4. Be Attentive and Participate

The Mass is not a performance to watch, but a divine mystery to enter into. Listen attentively to the readings and the homily. Sing joyfully, pray with your whole heart, and respond aloud with intention. When we participate actively, we become part of the sacred offering of the Church to God.

5. Receive the Eucharist Worthily

Before receiving Holy Communion, examine your conscience. If you are aware of serious sin, seek the Sacrament of Reconciliation first. The Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Christ, and receiving it with a clean heart allows the grace of the sacrament to bear fruit in your life.

6. Reflect After Mass

After the final blessing, take a few moments to remain in prayerful thanksgiving. Ask God to help you live out the grace you received during the week. Reflect on what you heard and how it might shape your thoughts, actions, and relationships.

Therefore, preparing for Sunday Mass is more than a habit—it's a spiritual discipline that deepens our relationship with God and the Church. By coming to Mass with a prepared heart, we allow the Lord to work in us more powerfully. Let us not treat the Eucharist as routine, but as the most sacred encounter of our week. May we all learn to approach each Sunday with reverence, love, and intentional worship.

Let our patron saint, Saint Francis Xavier, protect and pray for you.
