

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (HOLYDAY OF OBLIGATION) Mass on August 15th will be held at 5:30 p.m.

Every time a woman gets pregnant, her child leaves some of his cells in her body, even if the child later dies in the womb. This means that Mary carried the Blood of Christ within her always. We receive the Eucharist, and carry Christ within us temporarily, but Mary was never wholly separated from Him, even physically. The Body of Christ did not undergo decay. The Assumption is simply a further completion of that promise.

O Immaculate Mary, Assumed into heaven, you who are most blessed in the vision of God: of God the Father who exalted you among all creatures, of God the Son who willed that you bear Him as your Son and that you should be His Mother, of God the Holy Spirit who accomplished the human conception of the Savior in you. Comfort us from heaven, O merciful Mother, and guide us along your ways of purity and hope till the day of that blessed meeting with you and with your divine Son our Savior, Jesus. Amen!

"Overcoming Distractions: Deepening Focus During Sunday Mass"



In our busy and noisy world, distractions have become a constant part of our lives. Whether it's the buzzing of a phone, the thoughts about work, or even the person sitting next to us at church, it can be difficult to stay fully present during Sunday Mass. Yet, the Mass is the most sacred moment of our week—where heaven touches earth, where Christ gives Himself to us in Word and Sacrament. To honor this encounter, we must learn how to overcome distractions and deepen our focus.

1. Prepare Before You Arrive

One of the best ways to fight distraction is to prepare yourself spiritually and mentally before you even step into the church. Arrive early. Take a few minutes to kneel and quiet your heart. Offer a short prayer asking the Holy Spirit to help you stay attentive. Reflect on what you're bringing to the altar—your joys, your worries, your intentions. Mass is not a show to watch but a mystery to enter into.

2. Recognize the Battle

Distraction during prayer and worship is not unusual—it's part of the spiritual battle. Even saints struggled with wandering thoughts. What's important is not to give up or feel guilty, but to gently return your attention to God every time you notice your mind drifting. Think of it as bringing your heart back home, again and again.

3. Participate Actively

Mass is not a passive experience. Sing with the congregation, respond out loud, and follow the readings in your missal or app. When your body is engaged—standing, kneeling, listening—it helps your mind stay focused too. The more you understand what's happening at each part of the Mass, the more meaningful it becomes.

4. Limit External Distractions

Simple things like turning off your phone or avoiding idle chit-chat before Mass can make a big difference. If you attend Mass with children, prepare them in advance and help them engage at their level. Sitting closer to the altar can also help minimize visual distractions and keep your attention on the sanctuary.

5. Embrace the Silence

There are moments of silence built into the Mass—after the readings, during the Eucharistic Prayer, after Communion. Don't rush through them. Let them be spaces for deep personal prayer and reflection. In the silence, God speaks most clearly.

6. Take the Mass Home

What you hear and experience during Mass should echo into your week. Take note of a particular word, phrase, or homily point that touched your heart. Reflect on it throughout your day. When the Mass becomes a seed planted in your life, your desire to stay focused will grow naturally.

A Final Thought

A wise priest once said, "The devil doesn't need to tempt you to do evil. He just needs to keep you distracted." But when we intentionally offer God our full presence—especially during the Mass—we are drawn deeper into His presence and peace. Don't be discouraged by distractions. Keep showing up, keep trying, and trust that the Lord will meet you where you are.

Let us ask for the grace to listen with our hearts, to see with faith, and to receive with gratitude every time we gather at the altar.
