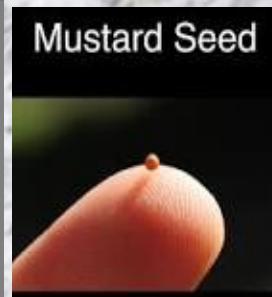

Our Lady of the Rosary**

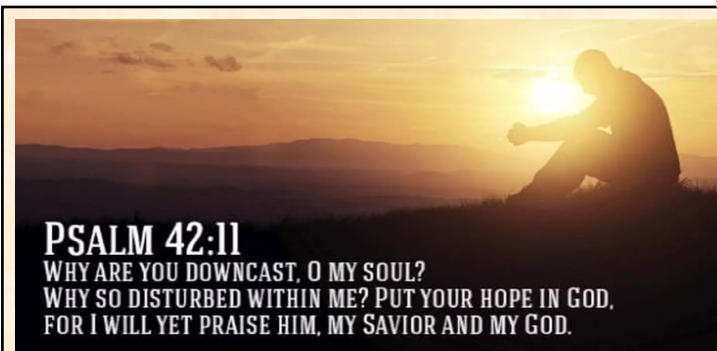

Sunday as a Day of Service: Extending Worship into Action



Every Sunday, we gather as a parish family to celebrate the Eucharist—the heart of our faith and the source of our Christian life. We come together to hear God’s Word, to be nourished by the Body and Blood of Christ, and to find strength in the fellowship of the community. Yet, the grace we receive at the altar is not meant to stay within the church walls. Sunday worship is a springboard that sends us out to live our faith in the world, and one of the most powerful ways we can do this is through service.

Sunday has always been considered the Lord’s Day, a time of rest, renewal, and rejoicing in God’s goodness. But it is also a day of mission. When we rest in the Lord, we also open our hearts to love and care for others. Pope Francis reminds us that true worship of God is inseparable from acts of charity and justice. In other words, prayer and service go hand in hand.

Extending worship into action means looking at Sunday not only as a day to receive but also as a day to give. The Eucharist reminds us of Christ’s sacrifice and calls us to imitate His self-giving love. Just as Jesus washed the feet of His disciples, so too are we called to serve those in need with humility and compassion.

This service can take many forms. For some, it may mean volunteering in parish ministries—helping as a lector, usher, altar server, catechist, or choir member. For others, it may mean acts of kindness in the family, such as visiting an elderly relative, preparing a meal for someone who is sick, or spending quality time with children. Still others may find ways to serve in the wider community—feeding the hungry, supporting a local shelter, or reaching out to a lonely neighbor. No act of love is too small when done with a generous heart.

Making Sunday a day of service also helps us live more fully the rhythm of Christian life. Worship sends us forth, service deepens our prayer, and together they form a cycle of love. When we serve others, we bring Christ’s presence into the world, and when we return to Mass the following week, we bring back all those encounters, joys, and struggles, offering them to God in thanksgiving.

As a part of Saint Francis Xavier, Our Lady of Lourdes, and Saint Aloysius church, we are invited to see Sundays not just as a time for obligation but as an opportunity for transformation. Imagine if every Sunday in our parish became not only a day of worship but also a day of outreach. Our community would shine more brightly as a beacon of hope, charity, and joy.

Let us make it a habit to ask ourselves each Sunday: How can I extend the love I have received at Mass into concrete service this week? In doing so, we will discover that Sunday truly becomes the Lord’s Day—not just in word, but in action.
