HOLY LAND PRAYER

As we approach All Souls' Day, the Church invites us to pause, remember, and pray for all our beloved dead. November is a sacred time to recall that our love for those who have gone before us does not end at the grave. Love is stronger than death, and prayer is the bridge that unites us still.

When we offer prayers for the departed, we are performing one of the greatest acts of mercy. Our prayers, offered in faith, help purify and strengthen the souls of those still journeying toward the fullness of God's presence. Just as we remember them in love, they intercede for us in return, forming one family of faith—the Communion of Saints.

While flowers fade and candles burn out, prayer endures. It is the one gift that never fails to reach heaven.

We invite everyone to write the names of your departed loved ones on your All Souls envelopes and bring them to the church on or before November 1. These envelopes will be placed near the altar and remembered in all our parish Masses throughout the month of November.

Let us make this act of prayer and remembrance a beautiful expression of faith and gratitude. Each Mass offered, each prayer whispered, becomes a light of hope for those we love.

May our prayers rise like incense before God, bringing peace to the souls of the faithful departed and comfort to our own hearts that still remember them with love.
