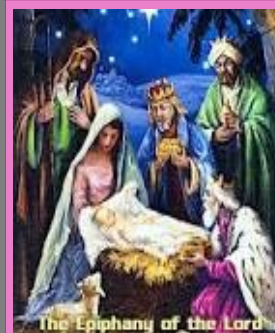

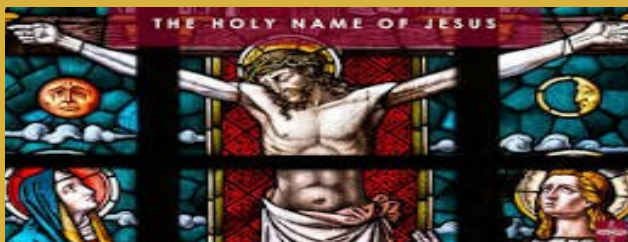
Epiphany House Blessing

It's tradition to bless your home on the Epiphany that all who enter it may be received as Christ in the coming year. Use chalk to mark your entry door with the phrase 20+C+M+B+26. The numbers represent the current year and CMB stand for the first three letters of the Magi's names (Caspar, Melchoir, Balthazar) as well as the first three letters of the Latin blessing: Christus Mansionem Benedicat, Latin for "May Christ bless this house".

Epiphany Prayer before or after "chalking door" (or any prayer you find appropriate)

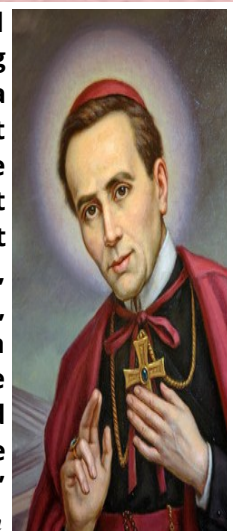
