DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN - JANUARY 22ND

On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its decision *Roe v. Wade*. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives, and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion. In the USA, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, designates January 22nd as a particular day of prayer and penance, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children".

Heavenly Father, in Your Love for us, protect against the wickedness of the devil, those helpless little ones to whom You have given the gift of life. Touch with pity the hearts of those women pregnant in our world today who are not thinking of motherhood. Help them to see that the child they carry is made in Your image – as well as theirs – made for eternal life. Dispel their fear and give them true womanly hearts to love their babies and give them birth and all the needed care that a mother can give. We ask this through Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord, Who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. Amen.


We will continue selling our Sunday's Missals until the end of February. The cost is \$5.00 and they are available in the back of the church.

The Holy Mass: From Gathering to Sending Forth



Every Sunday, young and old, families and individuals, we gather for the Holy Mass. Some of us have attended Mass for many years; others are still learning its beauty and rhythm. Yet the Mass is not just a routine—it is a journey of faith, guiding us from our daily lives into God's presence, and then sending us back renewed.

The Mass begins with the Entrance Procession. As the priest and ministers walk toward the altar, we stand and sing. This is not simply an opening song. It reminds us that we are a pilgrim people, walking together toward God. Whether we are young adults searching for direction or elders carrying many memories, we come as one Body in Christ.

We begin with the Sign of the Cross, marking ourselves in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In this simple gesture, we place our entire lives—our joys, struggles, hopes, and wounds—into God's hands. The greeting that follows, "The Lord be with you," assures us that God is truly present among His people.

In the Penitential Act, we humbly acknowledge our sins. This is not meant to discourage us but to remind us that God's mercy is greater than our weaknesses. Young people learning from mistakes and elders reflecting on life's journey are equally embraced by God's forgiveness.

The Liturgy of the Word invites us to listen. God speaks through Scripture, just as He did long ago. The Gospel, proclaimed with reverence, is Christ speaking directly to us today—into our families, workplaces, schools, and communities. The homily helps us connect God's Word with real life, reminding us that faith is meant to be lived, not only heard.

After professing our faith in the Creed and offering our prayers for the Church and the world, we move to the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Bread and wine are brought forward—simple gifts that represent our work, sacrifices, and daily lives. At the altar, through the power of the Holy Spirit, they become the Body and Blood of Christ. This is the heart of the Mass, where heaven touches earth.

In Holy Communion, we receive Jesus Himself. For the young, this strengthens them to face the future with faith. For the elderly, it renews hope and gives peace. In silence after Communion, we allow Christ to speak to our hearts personally.

The Mass ends with a blessing and dismissal. "Go forth, the Mass is ended." These words do not mean the celebration is over, but that it now continues in our lives. We are sent to love, to serve, and to be Christ to others.

The Mass is God's gift to every generation. When we understand it more deeply, we do not just attend Mass—we live it.
