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

34TH WORLD DAY OF THE SICK FEBRUARY 11TH

We will have a Healing Mass of the Sick and Anointing of the Sick at our 5:30 p.m. Mass on Wednesday, February 11th.

"Is any among you sick? Let him call for the presbyters of the Church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven" (Jas 5:14-15). CCC 1526

The sacrament of Anointing of the Sick has as its purpose the conferral of a special grace on the Christian experiencing the difficulties inherent in the condition of grave illness or old age. Each time a Christian falls seriously ill, he may receive the Anointing of the Sick, and also when, after he has received it, the illness worsens. CCC 1527



Understanding the Mass

The Greeting: "The Lord be with you."



After we begin the Mass in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, the priest extends a simple but powerful greeting: "The Lord be with you." It may sound like a polite opening, but in the liturgy, these words carry deep biblical and spiritual meaning.

Biblical Roots

"The Lord be with you" is not a modern phrase or a casual wish. It comes straight from Sacred Scripture. In the Old Testament, these words are spoken at moments when God calls someone for a mission:

- The angel greets Gideon: "The Lord is with you, O mighty warrior" (Judges 6:12).
- Boaz greets his workers: "The Lord be with you"—and they reply, "The Lord bless you" (Ruth 2:4).

In the New Testament, the angel Gabriel greets Mary with a similar assurance of God's presence: "The Lord is with you" (Luke 1:28).

Each time this greeting is spoken in the Bible, it signals God's active presence and the beginning of something holy. So, when we hear it at Mass, we are reminded that God is truly present here and now, and that He is about to act.

Why the Priest Says It

The priest does not say "The Lord be with you" simply as a friendly hello. He speaks these words in the name of Christ and by virtue of his ordination.

Through the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the priest is configured to Christ, the Head of the Church. When he greets the people, he is not relying on his own goodness or personality, but on Christ's promise to remain with His Church.

This is why the greeting is used at key moments of the Mass—before the Gospel, before the Preface, and before the final blessing. Each time, it prepares us to encounter the Lord more deeply: in His Word, in the Eucharist, and in our mission after Mass.

The People's Response and Our Shared Faith

The people respond: "And with your spirit."

This response is rich in meaning. It is not simply saying, "Hello, Father." Rather, the assembly is acknowledging the Spirit given to the priest at ordination. In other words, the people are saying:

"May the Holy Spirit who was given to you continue to guide you as you lead us in prayer."

This exchange shows that the Mass is not something the priest does alone while the people watch. It is an act of shared faith and mutual prayer. The priest prays for the people, and the people pray for the priest.

In this short dialogue, the Church becomes visible: one Body, many members, united by the presence of the Lord.

A Moment to Become Aware

Each time we hear "The Lord be with you," we are invited to pause interiorly and remember:

- God is here
- We are His people
- What we are about to celebrate is holy

The greeting is not a routine formula. It is a renewed assurance of God's closeness and a call to participate fully, consciously, and actively in the sacred mysteries.

As we continue reflecting on the parts of the Mass, may these familiar words never become ordinary to us, but always awaken our faith in the God who truly is with us.
